This is a series of amazing interviews conducted by a young Paul Hasluck in the 1920's when he met with Guildford old-timers, recording their memories and recollections of people in colonial times.



Sir Paul Meernaa Caedwalla Hasluck, was a Diplomat, Member of the House of Representatives (1949 – 1969), and the 17th Governor-General of Australia, in office from 1969 to 1974. As a child, his devoutly Salvation Army parents moved to Guildford, where they ran a nursing home, Riversleigh House, that was "the first non-government home for aged men in Western Australia". The electoral Division of Hasluck is named in his honour.
